

Use of Pupil Premium

2019/20

Current and Historic PPG

The most up-to-date information shows that at the end of academic year 2020 15% of the total school population are, or have been, entitled to claim 'Free School Meals' (FSM) at some time in the last six years during their primary school education. The entitlement figure had been stable but, in recent years, has started to show signs of decline. In the financial year 2019/20 the school received a total grant of £95740.

Data Analysis

There were 8 PPG pupils in the 2020 Y6 cohort (3 boys and 5 girls). This represented 25% of the cohort of 62 pupils. **Please note - in 2020, no statutory assessments were conducted so the analysis below is of our internal teacher assessments. For our last set of statutory results please consult 'Pupil Premium Grant Outcomes 2019.'**

Reading, Writing and Maths Combined

75% of Ings Farm PPG children in 2020 were awarded the combined measure of Reading/Writing/Maths at 'Expected Standard' and 13% were assessed as at the 'High Standard'. In 2019 the national pass rate was 64% at the 'Expected Standard' and 11% at the 'High Standard' for all children.

Reading

Of the 8 PPG children, 88% were awarded the 'Expected Standard' and 13% were assessed as at the 'High Standard' in Reading in 2020 compared to a 2019 national figure of 73% and 27% respectively.

Writing

Of the 8 PPG children, 88% were awarded the 'Expected Standard' and 13% were assessed as at the 'Greater Depth' grade in Writing in 2020 compared to a 2019 national pass rate of 78% and 20% respectively.

Mathematics

Of the 8 PPG children, 75% were awarded the 'Expected Standard' and 13% were assessed as at the 'High Standard' in Mathematics in 2020 compared to a 2019 national figure of 79% and 27% respectively.
